# **Grave Blessings**

Each year between Easter and Ascention our church blesses the graves of our faithfully departed brothers and sisters. Apparently here at Holy Cross this is normally all done on the first Sunday of May. Due to a bunch of things, including our First Solemn Communion Weekend and other events, and the fact that people tell me one day was hard because some people had to wait quite long, we will have grave blessings on 4 different evenings instead of one afternoon. We will do the following:

- Sunday, April 28, at 5 pm at St. Michael's Cemetery
- Saturday, May 4, at 5 pm at St. Michael's Cemetery
- Sunday, May 5, at 5 pm at Evergreen Cemetery
- Sunday, May 5, at 6 pm at St. Michael's Cemetery

To which one should you go to? Wherever your family is obviously, and at whatever time you find most convenient. I

expect each session will likely take less than 1 hour, however I will stay till all those present have their loved one's graves blessed. Each time we will start with a "Panachyda" at the main Cross or Monument, then I will go around to all families present.

# **Next Sunday**

(which is the last Sunday of the Month) we will have a CHILDREN'S LITURGY with a BAPTISM!

Jennifer, who is one of our First Solemn Communicants will be "taking the plunge" and fully accepting Christ through Baptism, Chismation and her First Eucharist. During the whole service I will be explaining things to the kids of the parish (and the adults too). The **following weekend (May 4 & 5)** she will be receiving, with the other F.S.Communicants, the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and then they will be able to come forward and receive the Eucharist on their own.

# New Format for our Bulletin

As you can see our bulletins are not exactly what they were before Fr. Bo came. Even though the bulletins are several pages thicker, in the big picture they actually cost less than what they were costing us before. This is because we are no longer needing to order the colour icon sheets from the USA.

However after several conversations I have decided to make some more changes, even though it is a bit more work for me. This is to further reduce costs and photocopying, yet without sacrificing any content.

- 1. The **Changeable Parts** for the liturgy will now be printed on a separate sheet, and will NOT be found on the back page of the bulletin. They will be available in the entrance of the church when you come in. It is our hope that families can now take only one bulletin and as many Changeable Parts sheets as needed, instead of each person taking the entire bulletin to follow along in the Liturgy.
- The "Kid's Page" is now also a separate "Kid's Bulletin." Now every every kid can get one. These too will be available in the entrance. However those without little kids will not have an extra page making their printed bulletin unnecessarily big. (But you can still take them for your grandkids if they wish).
- 3. As before all bulletins are still available online at our website, and soon we hope to have them back up on facebook (and other Social Media too).


All volunteers are welcome to stay for a night of fellowship and enjoy Camp Oselia.



- On Tuesday, April 30, **Young (and middle aged) Adults** will be having a Switch and Dish night. This is a Tournament where we will be playing "Super Mario Bros" on a few switches, we will be eating Vietnamese food, and we will talk about a relevant topic that we will choose on the spot. - Our **Sunday School** is going well. We are hoping to establish a leadership team to keep anyone from doing all the organizing themselves.
- Our **Elementary Children**, who have completed their First Solemn Communion Classes, can expect to meet every other week starting in the fall. At these meetings we will play games and watch movies, and also learn how to participate more fully in the Divine Liturgies. A couple of great Volunteers have stepped up for this group.



- Teens in Jr. & Sr. High schools, will likewise be meeting every other week where we will challenge them to play hard, to pray Fr. Bo in various competitions. Thanks again to the other Volunteers who are stepping up for this.
- Likely the Elementary as well as the Jr./Sr. Programs will take place on the same nights but in two different rooms within the church.
- We wont be planning a Summer Day Camp this summer, but if things go well, perhaps we will have one next year.
