The Icon of

Our Lady of Perpetual Help

Icons like saints are often celebrated on certain days of the year. Today, July 7th, is the feast of the Icon of "Our Lady of Perpetual Help" (OLPH).

This particular image is one of many miraculous icons known in the east as the "Theotokos of the Passions". In it Christ looks to the instruments of His Passion and Death in the arms of Archangel Gabriel. Opposite Gabriel is Archangel Michael also holding the spear with which Christ's side was pierced and the sponge with which vinegar was put up to his lips while He

hung on the Holy Life-Giving Cross. As Christ contemplates the Passion, the Theotokos looks at us and points to Her Divine Son in a way as to tell us that He contemplates the passion because of His love for us. Many explanations of why Jesus' shoe is falling off have been proposed over time. A common one is that the Passion is indeed something that scares the Christ Child, and therefore he quickly leaps to the comfort of His Mother's embrace, loosing a shoe in his haste.

In general icons of the Theotokos of the Passion belong to the category of Icons called "Hodegitria" (which is Greek for "The Way"). These Icons of our Lady show her pointing towards the source of our salvation; namely Her Son, Jesus.

This particular icon (OLPH) has been confused by some for being the third of the three original icons that the Evangelist Luke painted of the Virgin. However research and analysis of the icon point to the fact that it was painted in the 13th Century. The commonly told history of this image is that it hung in a monastery on the Greek island of Crete. In the 15th century it was stolen by a merchant and taken to the city of Rome, where it hung in his home for many years. On route from Crete to Rome with the icon the boat that the merchant was sailing

in was caught by a storm and nearly sank, but the merchant beseeched the Mother of God to save them, and the storm suddenly stopped.

After he arrives in Rome, the Theotokos herself appears to the merchant and asks him to take her image to a church where it can be publicly venerated, but he refused fearing that his crime would be found out. Soon after this he became ill. Before his death the merchant asked a friend to take the image to a church, but the friend upon receiving the icon took it to his home instead. Here once again the Virgin appeared to members of the family and warned them that her image was to be placed in a Church for public veneration, or if not sickness would befall them also. After refusing at first, the family did become ill then they relented and brought the icon to the Church of St. Matthew's on March 27th, 1499. Upon it's arrival a man's arm, which was crippled was miraculously made whole again.

The icon hung in the Church where many pilgrims flocked to the miracle granting icon for over 3 centuries. Over these years thousand of faithful including many popes prayed before the image.

In June of 1798, Napoleon and his army levelled St. Matthew's Church, so the icon was taken into hiding, however while in hiding the icon was forgotten for 64 years. A Redemptorist priest read about the icon and remembered how in his youth he has prayed before the holy image, and he remembered that location. He wrote to his supperiors, and after 3 years the icon finally made its ways to the Redemptorist's priests hands.

In 1866 Pope Pius IX had the icon was restored to the place where the church of St. Matthew's had once stood, which was the sight of the new church of St. Alphonsis. In 1867 the icon was "crowned" as is the tradition for icons that have become known for being miraculous.



The Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (Redemptorists) were charged by the Pope at that time to "Make her known throughout the world." as their founder St. Alphonsis did.

Today, this icon is commonly found in churches and homes in over 78 countries throughout the world, and has become a familiar, comforting and often miraculous focus for our prayers.

Most Holy Theotokos, Save Us.
