Holy, Glorious Apostle Thomas

Commemorated on October 6 from oca.org

The Holy and Glorious Apostle Thomas was born in the Galilean city of Pansada and was a fisherman. Hearing the good tidings of Jesus Christ, he left all and followed after Him. The Apostle Thomas is included in the number of the holy Twelve Apostles of the Savior.

According to Holy Scripture, the holy Apostle Thomas did not believe the reports of the other disciples about the Resurrection of Jesus Christ: "Unless I see in His hands the print of the nails,...

Our Fire Drill this spring went well. Right after the Divine Liturgy we all exited and headed to the Muster Point by the back fence. Not only did nobody get left behind, we also learned several things about our fire preparedness in our church. Here are some of those things:

- We need to ensure that all people leave the building BY
 THE NEAREST EXIT. Then people would have to walk
 around the building to get to the Muster Point. (At our drill, many people
 walked through the "pretend burning" building in order to get to the muster
 point through a convenient exit.)

Do you wish to read the Epistle during our Divine Liturgies?

Epistles are the letters of the Apostles (mostly Saint Paul, but a few others too) in the early church to various people and communities. It is one of two bigger scripture readings done during the Divine Liturgy. The liturgy of St. John Chrysostom has 237 scripture references, 124 have their basis in the Old Testament and 113 in the New.



It is our hope that a number of people who all take turns reading the Epistle. In particular this is a fantastic way for young people to get involved. If you are interested please talk to Ed Horyn. If you don't know who Ed is, just ask Fr. Bo and he will point Ed out to you.

-people with walkers or other mobility issues to use the nearest exit that has no obstacles.
- We need to direct people who have exited the building to quickly and calmly get to the Muster Point, so that we aren't in the way of any fire trucks.
- We will NOT check through the building to see if anyone is still within. This is the job of the Fire Department. Get out, and Stay out.
- When exiting if you are the last one, close all doors behind you. This
 would help prevent the fire from spreading quickly.
- We need to create a better path to exit the building at the South East doors of the Church. At this place there is a large gravel patch which is difficult for those with mobility issues to navigate.
- When there is snow on the ground, we need to create a snow free path at this same South East door of the church, as this was normally not cleared in the past.

Thank you all for helping us learn, and for being safety prepared. We won't likely do this on a regular basis... but you never know when we will have another safety drill, to keep you and everyone as safe as possible.

If you are new here at the parish we strongly encourage you to familiarize yourself with all the exits and locations of safety devices.

Did you know your pupils are the last part to stop working when you die?

Holy, Glorious Apostle Thomas continued


... and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into His side, I will not believe" (John 20:25).


On the eighth day after the Resurrection, the Lord appeared to the Apostle Thomas and showed him His wounds. "My Lord and my God," the Apostle cried out (John 20:28). "Thomas, being once weaker in faith than the other apostles," says Saint John Chrysostom, "toiled through the grace of God more bravely, more zealously and tirelessly than them all, so that he went preaching over nearly all the earth, not fearing to proclaim the Word of God to savage nations."

Some icons depicting this event are inscribed "The Doubting Thomas." This is incorrect. In Greek, the inscription reads, "The Touching of Thomas." In Slavonic, it says, "The Belief of Thomas." When Saint Thomas touched the Life-giving side of the Lord, he no longer had any doubts.

According to Church Tradition, the holy Apostle Thomas founded Christian churches in Palestine, Mesopotamia, Parthia, Ethiopia and India. Preaching the Gospel earned him a martyr's death. For having converted the wife and son of the prefect of the Indian city of Meliapur [Melipur], the holy apostle was locked up in prison, suffered torture, and finally, pierced with five spears, he departed to the Lord. Part of the relics of the holy Apostle Thomas are in India, in Hungary and on Mt. Athos. The name of the Apostle Thomas is associated with the Arabian (or Arapet) Icon of the Mother of God (September 6).

These will be distributed via our Schools to the most needy of families.






Bridge of Hope Annual Christmas Shoebox Campaign
