Do you wish to read the Epistle during our Divine Liturgies?

Epistles are the letters of the Apostles (mostly Saint Paul, but a few others too) in the early church to various people and communities. It is one of two bigger scripture readings done during the Divine Liturgy. The liturgy of St. John Chrysostom has 237 scripture references, 124 have their basis in the Old Testament and 113 in the New.



It is our hope that a number of people who all take turns reading the Epistle. In particular this is a fantastic way for young people to get involved. If you are interested please talk to Ed Horyn. If you don't know who Ed is, just ask Fr. Bo and he will point Ed out to you.

These will be distributed via our Schools to the most needy of families.




Bring these donations here to our parish and drop them into the bin in the entrance of the Church. We will be delivering these donations very soon... because the weather will be cold before we know it.

Join in Every other Wednesday at 6 pm as we explore the whole story of salvation from Creation to the Second Coming.


