### Holy Water and House Blessings

On the Feast of Theophany we bless water. And each year between the feasts of Theophany the Encounter it is traditional for people to invite the clergy to come and bless their homes, cars, farms, businesses and other things with this water.

In addition to the blessing of your home, this is also a great way for you to get to know your pastor, and your pastor to get to know you.

I am happy to come and bless your homes and other such, so let's book an appointment. The best way of doing this is by using your phone or computer to open this link: <u>https://</u> form.jotform.com/230137590935054

If you don't like using technology, simply call Fr. Bo at 780-340-3726 and he can book your appointment with you.



### What to Expect and Do for Home Blessings

House blessings typically take about 5-10 minutes. However I (Fr. Bo) would like to sit and get to know you a little. So I might stay up to 25-30 minutes if you let me. I will try not to exceed 30 minutes per household.

I will always give you a quick phone call or text from the previous person's place to let you know I'm on my way. If something comes up and it won't work for you call me on my cell: 780-340-3726, Likewise if something comes up for me I will try to give you as much notice as possible.

When I come, please gather your family and turn off any TVs, Radios and other such. We can start the blessing at your icon corner, or at your kitchen or dining room table. I will bring an icon and a candle with me, and we can put them on your table if you don't have your own icon corner.

After saying/singing the prescribed prayers, I can walk through your house sprinkling it with recently blessed Holy Water. Its not a bad idea to have someone leading me through the house so that I don't go any place I am not supposed to. This is a great job for a kid(s) to do if you have any children around. If you would rather me just stay in the one room instead of walking everywhere, just say so. God can bless all the house without me physically going anywhere.

Once I have sprinkled your home with Holy Water, we will conclude the prayers at the place where we started. After this we can visit for a little. I would love to know who you are a little better, what ideas you have for our church, and what we can do to serve you and your family better.

#### **Visiting**:

Personally I don't drink coffee, but I might accept a glass of water or a cup of tea at a few houses. (I think Deacon François does drink coffee... but perhaps it's best to ask him.) Please keep it simple. If I don't drink anything at all, please don't be insulted. If I bless 4-8 houses in a day and I drink a cup at each one... I will... well... need to make too many pit stops.

Don't worry about cleaning up before I come. I don't care if your house is tidy or more "lived in." Don't panic about having stuff around. My own house is certainly very "lived in".

And I love pets. I will bless them and play with them if you let me. No need to put them away unless they eat priests.

Finally I would like to let you know that you owe me nothing for house blessings. Many people think it's necessary to give an "envelope" but I am happy just to get to know you and serve you however we can.

I hope to see you soon.

**Do you live outside of the city?** Within reason... no problem. If you are around the general Edmonton area, and you anticipate me needing a little extra time to travel back and forth to your place: book two time slots back to back. Google Maps will help me find my way around.

The Icon we are painting is the Korsun Icon of the Theotokos (seen to the left). It is a beautiful yet simple Icon which has it's name from the Ukrainian city of Kherson. People have been cured of sickness, and saved from foreign invaders through the intersession of the Mother of God before this image. Perhaps though our prayers as we copy this Icon we too will feel God's healing and peace, and through us to the rest of the world.

### The workshops will happen on the Family Day Long Weekend in February (14-17) and on the first week of Lent March 2-8.
