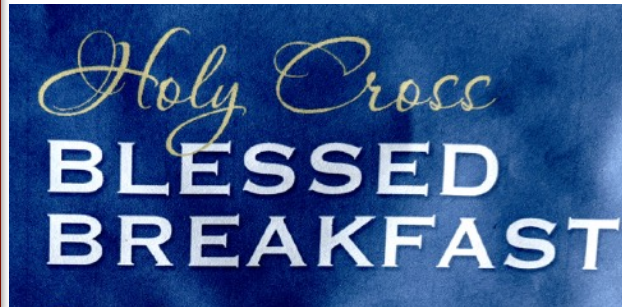

Statement to the Catholic Faithful by the Permanent Council of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops on the 2025 Federal Election

In this Jubilee Year of Hope 2025, as we prepare for a federal election in Canada, it is essential that, as citizens and Catholics, we reflect on the challenges currently facing our nation with a spirit of hope and a vision for a better future.

In a free and democratic society, all those eligible to vote have not only a right, but also a responsibility to engage with local candidates and political parties. We are called to discern which policies best serve the common good—that which the Church defines as “the sum of those conditions of ... social life whereby people, families and associations more adequately and readily may attain their own perfection” (Gaudium et Spes, n. 74.1). As faithful citizens, we are invited to help shape our earthly society in accordance with God’s divine plan, always mindful that “our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ” (Phil 3:20).

Our Catholic faith provides essential moral and social guidance, helping us understand and respond to the critical issues facing our country. The role of pastors—especially the Pope and bishops—is to articulate the principles of faith and Church teaching so that the lay faithful may form their consciences accordingly. As the Church teaches, it is the duty of the faithful “to see that the divine law is inscribed in the life of the earthly city” (Gaudium et Spes, n. 43.2).

There are many issues which we, as Catholics, are called to consider thoroughly when voting. Among them is the fundamental right to life—from conception to natural death. This right is being undermined by the lack of legal protection for the unborn, the ongoing expansion of eligibility for Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD), and the insufficient access to quality palliative care for those who are suffering at the end of life.

We must also advocate for the most vulnerable in our society: those living in poverty, victims of human trafficking, individuals suffering from mental illness and addiction, the homeless, and immigrants—each deserving of both social and legal support. Furthermore, there is increasing concern over growing intolerance toward religious communities in Canada, including threats to remove charitable tax status simply for upholding values rooted in faith that diverge from prevailing secular ideologies.

This election is a profound opportunity for Catholics to contribute to building a civilization of love. We are called to walk together in justice and truth with Indigenous Peoples. We are asked to examine policies that affect access to education, healthcare, housing, and social services for all, and to support initiatives that honour the family as the fundamental unit of society and uphold the dignity of every human person, created male and female in the image of God.

In a time of significant economic uncertainty, Canada needs a national economic vision that promotes the common good while respecting international obligations and fostering global solidarity. Economic development must be rooted in justice, stewardship of creation, and care for the vulnerable—both at home and abroad.

After careful reflection on these matters in the light of faith, we are called to form our consciences prayerfully and to express our convictions through our vote. Let us pray for our country, for all political candidates, and for our fellow citizens. Before casting our ballots, let us pause in personal prayer—perhaps by reciting the Lord’s Prayer—and ask God’s blessing upon those who will be elected to lead our nation.

What is the difference between a Pope, Metropolitan, Patriarch, Cardinal, Archbishop, Bishop, Eparch, an Exarch, an Auxiliary Bishop, a Bishop Emeritus, and other kids of Bishops?

The Church has three “levels” or ordained leadership. These are Deacons, Priests, and Bishops. Deacons are ordained primarily to serve the needs of the people and priests preach and teach, as well as make the Mysteries (Sacraments) available to the people. Bishops are the Administrators of the church who ensure the correct teaching of the faith, the smooth functioning of the Church and the continuation of the Church into the future. All bishops are of equal dignity but there are many kinds of bishops.

An ordinary type of **Bishop**, also known as an **Eparch** in the Ukrainian Catholic Church, is an ordained man who is in charge of a particular geographic area known as an Eparchy or a Diocese. For example: Our bishop, Bishop David Motiuk is the bishop who administers over all the Ukrainian Catholic Church in the province of Alberta, and his “seat” is in the city of Edmonton. His Eparchy is therefore known as the Eparchy of Edmonton. This means that he would oversee all Ukrainian Catholic parishes, monasteries, convents, schools, nursing homes, and other institutions in one way or another, sometimes directly, and sometimes indirectly.

A retired Bishop is known as a **Bishop Emeritus**, and a **Bishop Elect** is a priest who has been chosen to become a bishop, but who has not yet been ordained to that role.

In some cases there is an **Auxiliary Bishop**. This is a bishop who assists the bishop, but is subordinate to the ordinary bishop. They technically are in charge of a historic but no longer existing diocese. So without any people to take care of they assist the bishop to whom they have been assigned. Here in Canada we have one Auxiliary Bishop, who helps the Metropolitan Lawrence. His name is Auxiliary Bishop Andriy Rabyi.

An **Archbishop** in the Ukrainian Catholic Church is typically known as a **Metropolitan Bishop**. The Metropolitan of Canada is Metropolitan Lawrence Huculak, C.Ss.R. Technically he and all Metropolitans are both an archbishop and a Metropolitan, but the higher of the two titles is Metropolitan. Metropolitan Lawrence serves the Canadian Metropolia, out of the Archeparchy of Winnipeg. So a Metropolitan is the ordinary in his own eparchy, and the first among equals when the whole country gathers... (although in many other cases it is not necessary divided into a single country, it could be a portion of one, or several together).

An **Exarch** (unlike a Eparch) is a bishop who is in charge of a missionary territory (Exarchy), which is not established enough to become an Eparchy yet.

A **Patriarch** is the head of a particular Church. In the case of the Ukrainian Catholic Church, we acknowledge and treat our **Major-Archbishop** Sviatoslav Shevchuk as our Patriarch even though technically he has not yet been assigned that title by another Patriarch (yet). In the Catholic church only the Pope could grant this title to the leader of a Particular Church. We anticipate this will happen, however due to politics with our brothers and sisters in Moscow, this is not yet happening.

When the whole Catholic Church is gathered the bishop who leads it in the historical seat of the Apostle Peter, is called the **Pope**. His seat is the Bishop of Vatican City (in Rome). He is the leader of his Particular Church (the Roman Catholic Church normally) and the first amongst all the bishops world-wide. Until earlier last week Pope Francis was the Pope. Now following his death and burial a new Pope will be elected by the College of Cardinals.

A **Nuncio** is a Papal Ambassador to a particular country(s). They are normally bishops too and work within the Vatican.

A **Cardinal** is a bishop who has been elevated into a special group of advisors to the Pope, known as the College of Cardinals. They normally have a portfolio of which they are in charge. And in addition to their assigned “job” those under the age of 80 also have the duty to vote for the next Pope in the case of another’s death or stepping down. This meeting at which a new Pope is chosen is known as a conclave. It is conducted behind locked doors and communication with the rest of the world is forbidden so that there would not be interference from any outside source. Normally (at least for the past 900 years) a new Pope has been selected from one of the existing Cardinals, however technically one can be elected from among any baptized make Catholic person.

A Cardinal can be from any Particular Church, and there are a few who are from the Eastern Catholic Churches. There is even a Ukrainian Catholic Cardinal, Bishop Mykola Bychok, C.Ss.R. He is the Ukrainian Catholic bishop of Australia and all of Oceania.

Can a non-Roman Catholic Cardinal become a Pope? Yes, it is possible. Perhaps a little unlikely, but possible. Upon becoming the Pope the new Pope would have the faculty to celebrate in any service within any Rite of the Church.

1 Particular Churches: The Catholic Church is comprised of 23 different “Particular” Catholic Churches, including the Roman Catholic Church, the Ukrainian Catholic Church and others. This was talked about in a recent bulletin.

Who are our Canadian Bishops? Who is our Patriarch? Could one of them be the next Pope?



As mentioned on the previous page, any male Baptized Catholic could become the next Pope, but almost certainly the new Pope will be one of the Cardinals themselves. So it is extremely unlikely that any of the above will be elevated.

When will the Conclave take place?

We don't know. It will likely take place within the next couple weeks once all the Cardinals arrive in Vatican City. But the exact day it will start has not yet been decided by them.

Reflection and Results from Palm Sunday's Parish General Meeting about the possibility of hosting St. Mary's Eritrean Catholic Community in our Church

On April 13th, after our Divine Liturgy we had a Parish General Meeting to decide whether or not to host another Eastern Catholic Church within our Church building. In the end we voted and the result was 55 for and 100 against renting our building.

I, Fr. Bo, was and still am willing to hear the will of the parishioners and to abide by their decision. This is why I called the meeting in the first place.

The Church will not be rented to the St. Mary's Eritrean Community. They have been informed and are currently seeking another parish to host them for the foreseeable future.

I am a little surprised however at the emotions and insensitivity that were expressed by people at the meeting, and the unfounded fear that was used to influence others who were present.

As your Pastor I feel that I need to speak to this.

I must admit, I am intimidated in writing this reflection. It is not my goal to make anyone upset, even though some most probably will. Rather it is my goal to point out the truth, so that people can understand better what happened, and perhaps strive to improve their own behaviour.

The purpose of the Church on Earth of which we are a part of is to Follow Christ. Christ Himself gave the greatest commandment in the Gospel of Matthew Chapter 22 verses 37-40

“You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.” This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: ‘You shall love your neighbour as yourself.’ On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.”

All of Sacred Scripture is full of the instructions from God to love and serve the needs of others, regardless of who they are.

The issue of helping the Eritrean Parish Community was indeed about being authentic Church. It was about doing what was right in the sight of God. Yet some people insisted that this was a shameless strategy to manipulate the people and rather that the only reason for this rental was for funds.

The Parish Pastoral Council with myself clearly stated that this consideration was not about money at all. We were hoping not to lose money, nor to gain any, but rather to break even while helping others who wish to grow Christ's Church.

True, money is a reality we need to be aware of, and we are called to be wise stewards of the things we have received (by a lot of hard work). However the costs of hosting our brothers and sisters was to be covered by the incoming community. At the time of our meeting we were considering \$75 dollars an hour for the use of the Church. With our financial council members helping come up with that number, we thought it would be sufficient yet not burdensome for the other parish to pay. This amount was to be reviewed after 3 months when we would know the costs more accurately.

Arguments were put forward to alarm people to vote against hosting the others. For example, cost of office supplies, hall needs and other such costs were quoted to inflate the expenses. Yet these things had nothing to do with the prayers the other community would do in the Church.

Regardless. This was topic of money was not the most disappointing issue. What seriously concerns me as your pastor is the lack of compassion, the clear prejudice against others (yes, there was clear racial comments spoken), the threatening of people leaving if the decision did not suit their desire, and the immaturity of the cheering and jeering that people were involved in to belittle others.

We as a parish need to be honest. We need to be generous with God's blessings. We need to be kind to one another. We need to be accepting of all people, regardless of their race, gender, opinions or anything else. If we are not these things, then we are not Christ's Church.

I am trying to not let any of the comments of that meeting influence the relationships I have with any of the people in the parish. Somehow Christ was able to love and forgive all of humanity, even from the Cross. So I am going to try to let all the water flow under the proverbial bridge.

But what has become very clear to me is that we have a lot of growth ahead of us if we are to be the Church that Christ wants us to be. If we do not strive to grow in holiness and seek forgiveness for our failures, then we gather without purpose. And without purpose, what future is there for us all?

For those who are disappointed in the final results: keep your chins up and remain tenacious. We now see more clearly where we are lacking and where we need to grow. And we need each other to get there.

Everyone, let us put this behind us, and move forward towards Godliness.
