



The Feast of the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ

Jesus did not live with His disciples after His resurrection as He had before His death. Filled with the glory of His divinity, He appeared at different times and places to His people, assuring them that it was He, truly alive in His risen and glorified body.



To them He presented Himself alive after His passion by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days, and speaking of the Kingdom of God (Acts 1.3).

It should be noted that the time span of forty days is used many times in the Bible and signifies a temporal period of completeness and sufficiency (Gen 7.17; Ex 16.35, 24.18; Judg 3.11; 1 Sam 17.16; 1 Kg 19.8; Jon 3.4; Mt 4.2).

On the fortieth day after His passover, Jesus ascended into heaven to be glorified on the right hand of God (Acts 1.9–11; Mk 16.19; Lk24.51). The ascension of Christ is His final physical departure from this world after the resurrection. It is the formal completion of His mission in this world as the Messianic Saviour. It is His glorious return to the Father Who had sent Him into the world to accomplish the work that He had given him to do (Jn 17.4–5).

 \dots and lifting His hands He blessed them. While blessing them, He parted from them and was carried up into heaven. And they returned to Jerusalem with great joy (Lk 24.51–52).

The Church's celebration of the ascension, as all such festal celebrations, is not merely the remembrance of an event in Christ's life. Indeed, the ascension itself is not to be understood as though it were simply the supernatural event of a man floating up and away into the skies. The holy scripture stresses Christ's physical departure and His glorification with God the Father, together with the great joy which His disciples had as they received the promise of the Holy Spirit Who was to come to assure the Lord's presence with them, enabling them to...

The Feast of the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ

... be His witnesses to the ends of earth (Lk 24.48– 53; Acts 1.8–11; Mt 28.20; Mk 16.16–14).

In the Church the believers in Christ celebrate these very same realities with the conviction that it is for them and for all men that Christ's departure from this world has taken place. The Lord leaves in order to be glorified with God the Father and to glorify us with himself. He goes in order to "prepare a place" for and to take us also into the blessedness of God's presence. He goes to open the way for all flesh into the "heavenly sanctuary ... the Holy Place not made by hands" (see Hebrews 8–10). He goes in order send the Holy Spirit, Who proceeds from the Father to bear witness to Him and His gospel in the world, making Him powerfully present in the lives of disciples.

The liturgical hymns of the feast of the Ascension sing of all of these things. The antiphonal verses of the Divine Liturgy are taken from Psalms 47, 48, and 49. The troparion of the feast which is sung at the small entrance is also used as the post-communion hymn.

Thou hast ascended in glory O Christ our God, granting joy to Thy disciples by the promise of the Holy Spirit. Through the blessing they were assured that Thou art the Son of God, the Redeemer of the world! (Troparion).

When Thou didst fulfill the dispensation for our sake, and didst unite earth to heaven, Thou didst ascend in glory, O Christ our God, not being parted from those who love Thee, but remaining with them and crying: I am with you and no one will be against you! (Kontakion).

Third Finding of the Honorable Head of the Holy Glorious Prophet, Forerunner and Baptist John

Commemorated on May 25

The Third Discovery of the Venerable Head of the Holy Prophet, Forerunner and Baptist John occurred in about the year 850 (see the account of the First and Second Discoveries on February 24). The head of Saint John the Forerunner was first found on the Mount of Olives, where it had been hidden by Joanna, wife of Chusa, after the Saint's beheading; and found the second time in the city of Emesia during a time of unrest at Constantinople connected with the exile of Saint John Chrysostom (November 13).

It was transferred to Komana during the Saracen raids (about 810-820) and it was hidden in the ground during a period of iconoclastic persecution. When the veneration of icons was restored, Patriarch Ignatius (847-857) saw in a vision the place where the head of Saint John the Forerunner was hidden. The patriarch communicated this to the emperor, who sent a delegation to Komana. There the head was found a third time around the year 850.



Afterwards the head was again transferred to Constantinople, and on May 25 it was placed in a church. Today part of the head can be found on Mt. Athos. The Third Discovery of the Head of John the Baptist is commemorated on May 25.



Icon of the Mother of God "of the Passion"

Commemorated on the Sixth Sunday of Pascha (today) (again, from OCA.org)

The Icon of the Mother of God "Of the Passion" The icon received its name because on either side of the Mother of God are two angels with the implements of the Lord's suffering: the Cross, the Iance, and the sponge. There was a certain pious woman, Katherine, who began to suffer seizures and madness after her marriage. She ran off into the forest and attempted suicide more than once.

In a moment of clarity she prayed to the Mother of God and vowed that if she were healed, she would enter a monastery. After recovering her health, she only remembered her vow after a long time. Afraid and mentally afflicted, she took to her bed. Three times the Most Holy Theotokos appeared to her, commanding the sick woman to go to Novgorod and to buy Her icon from the iconographer Gregory.

After she had done this, Katherine received healing. From that time on, miracles have occurred from this icon. The icon is also commemorated on April 30, and on the sixth Sunday after Pascha (the Sunday of the Blind Man) in memory of the miracles which occurred on this day.

Yesterday, Saturday, May 24th, Fr. Bo taught the Grade 5 class of "Ridna Shkola" about Icons and Iconography.



Where can I go to enter people into the draw barrel? and where can I get "Anti-Pink-Flamingo" Insurance?

Online at our parish website. <u>EHCUCP.ca</u> but not yet... see the next question.

When can I nominate my friends, family and coworkers?

I hope to have this all set up and ready to go by Wednesday or Thursday this week. You will be able to nominate people until "Flamingo Week" which will be sometimes this Summer.

When will the Flamingoes be put on people's lawns?

On "Flamingo Week" the dates of which our Outreach Team will decide soon. Likely in early July.

What information will you need to collect from me?

To nominate someone, you will need to provide us with your name and email, as well as their name, email and address. If you want insurance you will need to provide us with your name, email and you address.

Will the information be shared with others?

Nope. We will not share this information with anyone.

How will you be collecting the money?

It will all be done securely online. You can make the transaction with PayPal or any credit card.

How many flamingoes do we have access to?

Over 100, but I don't know if all of them will be used at the same time.

How long will the flamingoes be on the "lucky" people's lawns?

About 12 hours... We will set them up in the morning and collect them in the evening.

What if I bought insurance and someone else puts flamingoes on my lawn?

Well... we can only tell you that if you have a valid insurance policy protecting you from our flamingoes, that we will not put any flamingoes (or other lawn ornaments) on your lawn during Flamingo Week. We however will not be able to prevent others from doing so.

What if the person I want to nominate doesn't have a lawn?

If there is no lawn, we will bring a pot of dirt, and put just a few flamingoes near their door. No problem.

What if the person I want to nominate doesn't have an email?

Hmmmm... this is a little bit of a problem. In order for that person to be warned and to have a chance to participate they would need access to a computer, and have an email. If you are close to that person and wish to help them, then perhaps... stay tuned.

Can I nominate someone from outside of Edmonton?

You can.... but we are only willing to drive within Edmonton, Sherwood Park, St. Albert, Stoney Plain, and Spruce Grove to plant our flock of flamingoes and pick them up again. Further than that... they are likely safe from getting the flock on their lawn.

What if they get drawn but really don't want flamingoes on their lawn.

If they don't want to support us by purchasing "Anti-Pink-Flamingo Insurance" and they do not want the flock of birds on their lawn, and if they happen to get drawn, then... they can simply ask us to remove the birds from their lawn. Our goal is to have fun and raise some funds for needy kids, not to upset people.

Who will benefit from this fundraiser?

All the proceeds of this fundraiser will go to needy children and their families as chosen by a School Social Worker in one or more of our Edmonton Catholic Schools. We will not share the names of the families as this would be inappropriate.

Can I get a tax receipt for getting insurance or nominating people?

Nope. Sorry. You can only get a tax receipt if you make a donation to a registered charity such as the parish. Unfortunately our new Outreach Team is not a registered charity.

Can I make a donation towards this initiative without putting anyone into the draw barrel, and without getting insurance?

Yes I believe we can accept donations through the Church. Please put it into an envelope and clearly label it as "a donation towards the Outreach Team to support the Flamingo Fundraiser." just like you would a regular donation to the parish. I will need to ask our treasurer if this could earn you a tax receipt however.

Didn't Camp Oselia do this fundraiser a few years ago.

Yup, and now our parish's Outreach Team is doing it.
