Sunday of the Holy Forefathers; Tone 2; The Holy Martyrs Thyrsus, Leucius, Philemon, Apollonius, and Callinicus




The "Forte Plus" concert at our church brought in \$1300 for an important charity in our community.

# The Sunday of the Holy Forefathers

The Sunday of the Holy Forefathers is a feast day, falling between December 11-17, commemorating the righteous ancestors of Christ from Adam throughout the Old Testament, like <u>Abraham</u>, <u>Jacob</u>, <u>Moses</u>, and the prophets, who awaited the coming of the Messiah, linking the generations before the Nativity to the fulfillment of God's promises in Jesus...


#### **Confessions:**

#### **Key Aspects:**

- Timing: Always the Sunday between December 11th and 17th, two Sundays before Christmas.
- Who are Remembered: All the Old Testament righteous who prepared for Christ, including patriarchs such as Adam, Noah, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, and prophets like, Isaiah, Samuel, and Daniel.
- Nativity Fast: It's part of the Nativity Fast, preparing the faithful for the celebration of Christ's incarnation.
- Next Sunday: The following Sunday, before Christmas, is the "Sunday of the Holy Fathers," remembering those of direct lineage to Christ's, like King David, and saint Joseph the Just.


### **Parish Announcements**

- Safer Environments: Please keep working on your "Safer Environments" paperwork. All volunteers in the parish, regardless of how small or big a

volunteer you are, are required to give us some information. Those who are "General Risk" volunteers, such as greeters, kitchen helpers, table and chair setter uppers, only need to fill out 2 simple forms. "Higher Risk" volunteers are those who work with children, seniors, the disabled, new immigrants and/or other vulnerable people, as well as those who have keys to the building or handle the parish's funds. These wonderful volunteers need to fill out a few forms and then also do a 45 minute online training, and a police information check. If you are a volunteer and you have not been asked to fill out forms yet, please see Fr. Bo.

If you have not gotten an email from the Eparchy so that you can do your training (for Higher Risk Volunteers), please be patient. Fr. Bo will work on this early in the new year.

# Announcements from our Eparchy

 The Jubilee Year declared by the late Pope Francis, Pilgrims of Hope - Hope Does Not Disappoint, ends on January 6, 2026 with the closing of the Holy Door at Saint Peter's Basilica, Rome. The date is the Feast of the Theophany of Our Lord Jesus Christ. The Holy Doors at the other major basilicas in Rome will close a few days earlier, on Sunday, December 28, 2025. The Jubilee Year has been a year of grace, led by the Holy Spirit, focusing on conversion, forgiveness, abundance, walk, and mercy. In the words of Pope Francis, 'Hope is the light that brightens the future... The light is Jesus, who with the very Word, gathers every people and every nation. We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us, and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision.' The Eparchy of Edmonton's celebration of the Jubilee Year was marked by several events: Sunday Divine Liturgy intentions for hope and conversion; Travelling Miraculous Icon of the Mother of God from parish to parish; Pilgrimage of Hope to Blessed Vasyl Velychkowsky Shrine, Winnipeg; Annual Saints Peter and Paul Mundare Vidpust: and Worldwide Ukrainian Catholic Jubilee in Rome with Pope Francis. The Jubilee Year Closing Celebrations in the Eparchy of Edmonton will be led by Bishop David with the celebration of the 9:30 am Divine Liturgy, Sunday,

December 28, at Saint Josaphat Cathedral. The clergy, religious, seminarians, and lay faithful from all parishes are welcomed to attend.

 What is the "Bishop Budka Charitable Society"? It was established in 1984 to carry out projects and programs that offer national and international assistance, development, and emergency relief. The Society is named after Bishop Nykyta Budka (1877–1949), who was consecrated bishop NEW in October 1912 and in December that year became the first Ukrainian Catholic Bishop in Canada. Later, years after his return to western Ukraine, he was arrested by the Soviet authorities in 1945 and interned in a labour camp in Karaganda, Kazakh SSR, where he died. Bishop Budka died a martyr for his faith and was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 2001. A few examples of the Bishop Budka Charitable Society's support over the years include the following: Helped equip a rehabilitation department in a regional hospital in Ukraine; Assisted in the building of a rehabilitation centre for a drug and alcohol facility in Brazil; Funded a Ukrainian children's camp in Bosnia; Delivered and erected a children's playground in Ukraine; Financially contributed to English language classes for newly arrived displaced persons from war-torn Ukraine.


