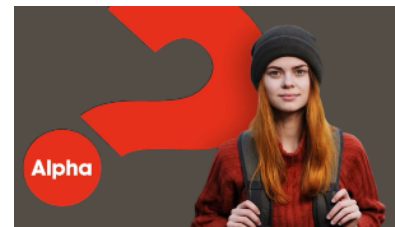
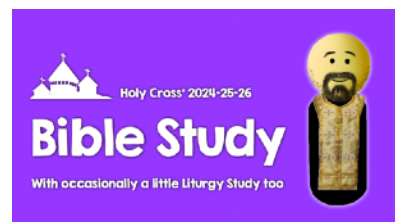


2026 is fully here and it's time to (re-)Encounter God!

A message from our fabulous Frozen Ukrainian Food Folk

On behalf of the Frozen Food Department we would like to say an extra special thank you to all of our members that have dedicated their time to this project. We have had a very profitable 2025 year in sales for our Parish. In fact, we have substantially exceeded 2024's gains. Without our volunteers this would not have been such a success. I would also like to extend appreciation to those that have dedicated their time to the department with key roles that are behind the scenes. It takes countless hours to prepare for our bees in regards to purchasing, prep and execution. We look forward to another year of success for our Parish. And we also look forward to the fellowship during our bees where the time spent together is priceless.

With Easter upon us early this year and our next Perogy supper on February 14th, we will be having a very busy next few months. We have scheduled a perogy bee on **January 20th at 9am**. As most of you know, preparation for especially perogy bees is quite intense. We have decided to peel potatoes **on the 18th after coffee hour**. Normally we have been peeling the day before the bee but we have struggled to have members to show up very very early in the morning to complete this task. So we thought to try doing it a different way that may be easier for our volunteers. More hands make the task light and when we have 300lbs of potatoes to peel...the more the merrier! We will still be making the potatoes into balls on Monday the 19th at 9am.

Also, we just recently purchased 500lbs of cabbage that we are preparing for sweet and sour cabbage rolls. 100lbs of cabbage are quietly curing right now, and the other 400lbs are awaiting for us for our next bee which will be scheduled for **February 3rd at 9am**. On this day we will make what we require for perogy supper as well as begin to store for Easter sales.

For any of our Parishioners that have interest in becoming a part of our team please give Terry or myself a call. There are many things that we could use help with! The more people that we can train, the better our project! These include:

- perogy dough masters
- phone messages and sales
- rice masters for cabbage rolls
- post bee packaging and storage

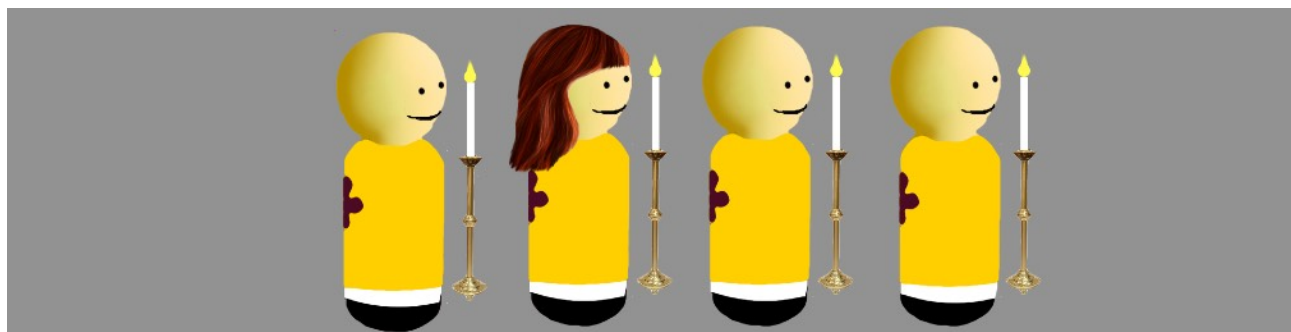

- Please consider being part of our **Parish Pastoral Council in 2026**. This is the group that works with the clergy to run the parish. If you are interested please talk to Mark Helmack, or speak to the parish though the parish office on Wednesday mornings.
- Our parish is **looking for a volunteer to be our Kitchen Coordinator**. Please include contact information for them. **Everyone is important in our parish. Let's not leave anyone out.**

- **Our Question Box:** In our Church's entry there is a "Question Box". If you have a question about our Faith, Church or Traditions, simply write it down and drop it into the box. Fr. Bo will try to answer your question in one of the next bulletins.
- **Are you having a 50th Wedding Anniversary?** If so put your anniversary on the sheet on the table next to the parish office or talk to Diana Horyn 780-255-9926. Holy Cross Parish will honour you with a plaque at the end of a Divine Liturgy.
- **Safer Environments: Please keep working on your "Safer Environments" paperwork.** All volunteers in the parish, regardless of how small or big a volunteer you are, are required to give us some information. Those who are "General Risk" volunteers, such as greeters, kitchen helpers, table and chair setter uppers, only need to fill out 2 simple forms. "Higher Risk" volunteers are those who work with children, seniors, the disabled, new immigrants and/or other vulnerable people, as well as those who have keys to the building or handle the parish's funds. These wonderful volunteers need to fill out a few forms and then also do a 45 minute online training, and a police information check. **If you are a volunteer and you have not been asked to fill out forms yet, please see Fr. Bo.**

If you have not gotten an email from the Eparchy so that you can do your training (for Higher Risk Volunteers), please be patient. Fr. Bo will work on this early in the new year.

- **Almost Every Monday Evening: Some sort of Parish Meeting**, including but not limited to: Ladies' Club (typically the 1st Monday at 7), Knights of Columbus (typically the 2nd Monday at 7:30), Men's Club (typically the 3rd Monday at 7), and Parish Pastoral Council (typically the last Monday at 7). Announcements from our Eparchy

- **What is the "Bishop Budka Charitable Society"?**
It was established in 1984 to carry out projects and programs that offer national and international assistance, development, and emergency relief. The Society is named after Bishop Nykyta Budka (1877–1949), who was consecrated bishop in October 1912 and in December that year became the first Ukrainian Catholic Bishop in Canada. Later, years after his return to western Ukraine, he was arrested by the Soviet authorities in 1945 and interned in a labour camp in Karaganda, Kazakh SSR, where he died. Bishop Budka died a martyr for his faith and was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 2001. A few examples of the Bishop Budka Charitable Society's support over the years include the following: Helped equip a rehabilitation department in a regional hospital in Ukraine; Assisted in the building of a rehabilitation centre for a drug and alcohol facility in Brazil; Funded a Ukrainian children's camp in Bosnia; Delivered and erected a children's playground in Ukraine; Financially contributed to English language classes for newly arrived displaced persons from war-torn Ukraine.

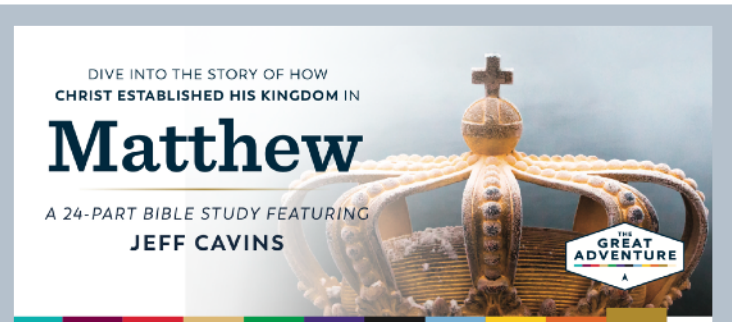

The Story of How Christ Established His Kingdom

Matthew: The King and His Kingdom shows how Jesus fulfills God's promises to Israel and establishes his kingdom on earth. Through references to the Old Testament promises of God to his people and the messages God sent them through the prophets, this Bible study provides the key to understanding the rest of the New Testament and Christ as the fulfillment of God's plan.

Matthew portrays Jesus as the true King who fulfills the Law the people of Israel have failed to keep and who introduces the new law that will accompany the New Covenant. In this 24-part study of Matthew's Gospel, Jeff Cavins explains how Jesus is challenging and empowering us to a new level of holiness and shows how we must be thoroughly immersed in the kingdom of heaven on earth, the Church, to live it.

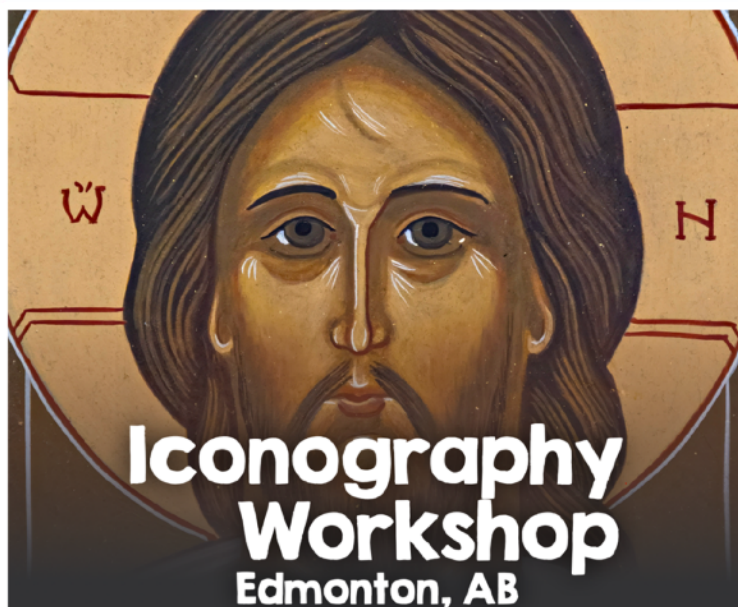


