

Vote on adoption of new by-laws

To all members of Holy Cross.

There will be a special meeting held on March 8 to vote on the adoption of new parish bylaws. The eparchy recently sent a notification to all parishes that every parish must have a set of by-laws to support the good and faithful operation of the parish by the pastor and parishioners. An updated set of by-law guidelines was sent out to all pastors to review with their councils and if their current by-laws are significantly different from the new template then updates need to be considered. All parishes within the eparchy will need to be compliant with the new guidelines.

Prior to this notification, the parish council has been reviewing our current set of by-laws, which are quite dated and not reflective of the way we have to currently operate. This gave us the opportunity to make the necessary changes to our old by-laws and be compliant with the new guidelines provided by the Eparchy.

What's the Lenten Liturgy Plan?

During the Great Fast (aka Lent) Divine Liturgies are not celebrated on weekdays within the Ukrainian Catholic Church. And any Liturgies that are celebrated on the weekends are the Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great.

Sunday mornings services remain at 10 am as usual, but the priest's parts are a little longer, so liturgy may last a little longer than usual (maybe 10 minutes).

Instead of our regular Wednesday morning service, we will have Wednesday evening Presanctified Liturgies when possible at 5:30 pm. These beautiful services with amazing melodies are a combination of the Vespers (evening) Service with a Eucharistic distribution. Unlike Divine Liturgies where at the two entrances the Gospel Book and the bread and wine are carried around the Church, at Presanctified Liturgies the Lord Himself, in the Eucharist is carried among the people. I encourage everyone to attend and worship our God at these profound evening prayers.

If there are regularly scheduled events after the Wednesday Presanctified Liturgies, they will be pushed from 6 pm to 6:30 pm to accommodate those attending the services.

On Fridays, on which we also normally have a service during the Fasting season, we will be praying the Akathist to


the Blessed Mother of God. This is a beautiful set of sung poetry that praises her role in our salvation by being willing to bear Christ in her virginal womb. These services will take place at 10 am when possible.

On Fridays that precede an "All Souls Saturday" (the 2nd, 3rd & 4th Saturdays of Lent), we will also do a panachyda with the reading of all the parish's deceased's names. This service is called "Soroko-oosteh" which can be translated to English as "40 mouths". It is called this because in some parishes they would have 40 or more people reading out the names of all the deceased.

If you would like to update your family's list of loved one's names, or start a list if you don't have one. Please see Fr. Bo or Deacon John, or come a few minutes early, or stay late, to any of the weekday services.

This year, like most years, the Great Fast is a busy time for the clergy as they need to hear more confessions than normal, preach extra retreats, run extra workshops and do extra stuff of all sorts. Because of this reality, and the fact that our parish only has one priest, unfortunately some of our Lenten Services will not take place. So please check out this extra "Lenten Service Schedule" to see when we will actually have services in our parish this Lent.
